Player Profile: Senior Class of 2010



Seniors Include:

#7 Lindley Brown- Lindley was an outside hitter who hit those difficult line shots for us. She also played back row defense. Lindley was selected to the 2nd Team All-District Team. She concluded the season with 122 digs, 236 attacks, 122 kills, 4 set assists, 7 blocks, and 12 aces.

#9 Allye Killman - This was Allye's first year on varsity and she came in and played a big role on the court. She played outside hitter and back-up setter. Allye ended with 34 digs, 106 attacks, 47 kills, 54 set assists, 23 blocks, and 5 aces.

#10 Chelsey Herrington - Chelsey played the middle position for us as a hitter, blocker, and back row player. Chelsey's leadership and play will be missed next season. Chelsey had 63 digs, 299 attacks, 170 kills, 14 assists, 55 blocks, and 12 aces.

#14 Sydney Caffey- Sydney also played the middle position as a blocker, hitter, and back row player. She was just as strong as a back row hitter as she was front row. She was selected to the 2nd Team All-District Team. Her season ended with 72 digs, 340 attacks, 207 kills, 24 set assists, 41 blocks, and 35 aces.

#15 Brooklyn Moore- Brooklyn played the setter position. She also had good back row defense. Brooklyn was injured early in the season and missed some games. She worked her way back and played strong. She ended her career with 41 digs, 1 attack, 116 set assists, and 6 aces.
