Call to Order: 4:00 p.m.

Call to order: Paula Chisholm called the meeting to order and welcomed members. Mrs. Chisholm introduced Susan Graham, School Health Consultant from Region 14, who presented a program on building a Coordinated School Health Leadership Team in our district. She has asked Clyde ISD and Breckenridge ISD to pilot this new leadership program.

Coordinated School Health Committee Presentation by Susan Graham: The purpose of the CSH Leadership Team is to make health a priority in the community. The team will focus on the eight components of Coordinated School Health and choose activities or projects that revolve around those eight components. The committee viewed three videos that supported the value of the Coordinated School Health program.

Mrs. Graham explained that the team would be made up mostly of school personnel whereas, the SHAC is comprised more of parents and few school employees; however, members of the SHAC would be welcome to serve on both committees as well as parents and community members who wish to serve on specific projects. Each member of the CSH Leadership Team will bring expertise in one of the eight components: health ed., nutrition, physical education, parent and community involvement, health services, healthy and safe school environment, counseling and mental health, and staff wellness promotion.

Next year the CSH Leadership Team will focus on the 40 Developmental Assets for Adolescents. Examples of projects were discussed that would incorporate the 40 assets.

The committee also discussed the need to advertise to involve the whole community in any project chosen by the team.

“Fill the Bus Project”: Efrain Gonzalez updated the SHAC Committee on the April 7th meeting concerning the “Fill the Bus” project. He informed the committee that he had applied for a grant from Pepsi. The asking amount was \$50,000. Mary Ann Olson would be working on a grant provided through Wal-Mart for another \$100,000. All grant funds would be used to fund the project and provide school supplies for all BIDS students in grades K-12.
